Graduates of ILISTF training actively engaged in health education efforts and health promotion -related to decreasing the likelihood of a campus outbreak of H1N1 flu - through active participation and support of eleven seasonal flu clinics (supporting Student Health Service (SHS) professional staff), ten Points of Distribution (POD) clinics (supporting campus and SHS professional staff); through one-on-one contact at weekly Flu Information tables (located in high-student-traffic areas during Campus Life - over 6,000 flu information/flu care packets distributed); through efforts supporting outreach that included assisting in the preparation of materials to be distributed (including Flu Information, Flu Care, Flu Prevention packets); through social network advertising campaign (utilizing social networks), and, through their support during information workshops presented to professionals and students (including RA's, RHD's, Commuter Student Services).

With additional support from SPVAC (Stony Brook Volunteer Ambulance Corps), C-Cert, and students from SBU's Nursing School, the ILISTF supported efforts resulting in over 6,000 Stony Brook student vaccinations and the campus distribution of flu prevention, flu care, flu education and related resource information.
