

HIV Testing

is part of part of good health care

Talk with your primary care provider

You may be at risk for HIV infection if you:

- have unprotected oral, anal, or vaginal sex with men, women, or both
- don't know a partner's sexual health history
- received a diagnosis of another sexually transmitted infection (STI)
- use injection drugs



Talk about testing today.

- Testing is the only way to find out if you have HIV. Symptoms typically take years to develop.
- One test may not be enough. If you have had "risky" sexual contact within the past three months, you may need to be re-tested.
- While you're at it, consider testing for other STIs: co-infection is common.
- If you can't test today, consider making an appointment to test at a later date.
